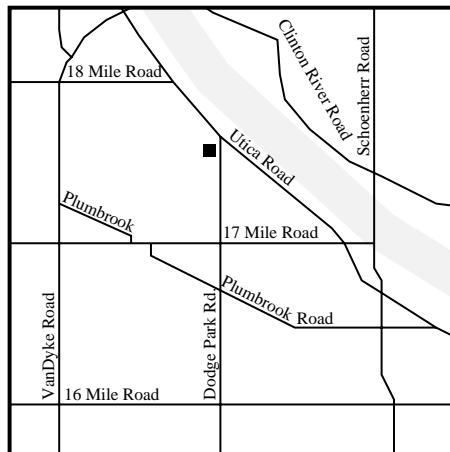

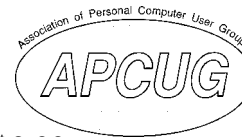
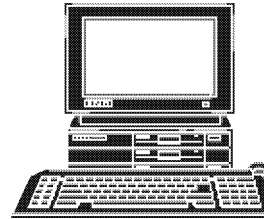

### Constitutional Vote In April

A vote to amend the constitution's Article V. OFFICERS will take place during the business portion of the April meeting. All members present at the meeting will be able to vote. The vote is by majority of the members present at this meeting. The proposed amendment was submitted in writing at the February meeting, was read and discussed. The amendment is as follows:

#### ARTICLE V. OFFICERS

Section 5. Only members in good standing are eligible to run for office.

Section 6. When officers commence their term, their membership shall be extended by the term of a renewing current member. If an officer leaves office for any reason before the end of their term, the extension to their membership shall be revoked.

The constitution of the SHCC

states that "The Constitution may be amended by a majority of the total membership at a regular meeting. Proposal for amendments shall be submitted in writing at a regular meeting and shall be voted on at the next regular meeting".

The floor will be opened for discussion on the proposed amendment prior to the vote.

Last month during the discussion of the proposed amendment, a second version of the amendment was suggested. The suggested change extends the membership of officers by the number of months that they serve in office. Since the changed proposed amendment was not submitted in writing, it will not be voted on in April. If the proposed amendment currently on the floor fail to be passed, this second amendment will be submitted in writing.

You'll just slip this diskette in your A drive, boot your computer from floppy, type CMOS\_RAM, press return, and after a short but delightful introductory screen the program will let you restore your CMOS RAM

information from a disk file.

This program also comes with a lookout utility that keeps an eye on your configuration file. If you ever change your configuration, it will prompt you to update your CMOS RAM backup. This lookout utility, called CHEKMOS, is also smart enough to watch your battery voltage and alert you if it starts to fade.

Dear Experts,

I like MS-Windows font capabilities, but cannot stand the font used on the Windows icons. How can I change the font size and the actual font of the icon descriptions in Program Manager?

Dear Unknown,

Please be careful with the following solution, make a backup of your WIN.INI file

that resides in your Windows directory. The default font is MS SanSeriff at 8 point. To change the font, open up the WIN.INI file with your favorite editor or SYSEDIT. Search for the [Desktop] section. Add the following lines to this section if they don't exist:

```
IconTitleSize=x
IconTitleFaceName=y
```

where 'x' is the font point size between 4 and 72, and 'y' is the font name. Please note the following dangers. The font name needs to match a font that is loaded and available in Windows (see the Control Panel Fonts for list of installed fonts). The point size number should not be greater than 10 point if you want to keep your icons close together without overlapping the titles.

Have fun experimenting, and remember, if you really mess things up, copy that backup of WIN.INI to the actual WIN.INI and all will revert to normal!

My computer's down; call back later.

from Craig. It seems the old hard disk controller wasn't fast enough for the new motherboard. I somewhat expected this, so after Craig made a very attractive offer on a new one, I had him replace it. Craig also pointed out that 1 Meg isn't really enough for most applications, he offers memory upgrades for \$70 / Meg. Since I knew I could get memory cheaper elsewhere, I didn't have him install any extra memory. He didn't charge any extra labor, even through to install the new controller he had to back off the data, re-format the drive and re-install.

My new system was delivered Sunday, a day early. First I tested to make sure it worked and ran a little benchmark program. Over 17 times faster than my old XT! Next, I opened the case and did the memory upgrade. I replaced the 4 256K SIMMs with 4Meg SIMMs. Here's where I ran into a little trouble. With 16 Meg. installed the machine would only power-up 1 out of 4 times. When it did power up it would work fine, except the clock was reset. I called Craig and he agreed that it seemed to be a motherboard problem and would replace it. He came and picked it up on Thursday.

Unfortunately, he had a spurt of business about that time and wasn't able to get my machine back until the next Wednesday. I can now report that I have a 486SX-33Mz for \$199 and an old XT motherboard. The downside is I still have the old 10 Meg hard disk, the 360K floppy (full height), and a CGA monitor. Still, it is a lot better than what I had before.

Overall, I recommend this to anyone who has an older computer. In fact, I'm having an old AT upgraded now. There were a few problems and I still have my old components so my system isn't as good as a whole new system. I still think it is worthwhile.

Disclaimers: I am not affiliated with Craig or Craig Computers (other than a customer). I don't get a commission. I only know what happened with my upgrade, your mileage may vary.
