

Constitutional Vote In June

A constitutional amendment was presented in writing by Chet Frelick at the May 3, 1994 meeting. This amendment will raise dues from \$20 to \$25 by altering Section 1 of Article VIII. The vote on the amendment will take place at the June 7, 1994 meeting.

The reason for the raising of dues is to allow the officers to find a bigger location for our regular meetings. The cost of meeting rooms has been anywhere from \$100 to \$200 which is more than our annual budget can support at current membership levels. There have been other issues concerning a meeting location such as room size, availability, and location. Several members have had suggestions, but none of the more inexpensive options are viable at this time.

The first sentence of Article VIII Section 1 currently reads as follows:

The annual dues for member-



Library Access

In months past we ran an article about accessing the public libraries' data base by modem. An 800 access number has been added for people in areas not covered by local access numbers. Since that time the access phone numbers have been changed. The new phone numbers are listed below. If you can use the local access number, please do, so that the library group will not incur needless charges.

Communications protocol is 8 bit, no parity, and one stop bit (8N1).

accidentally skipping a file or two.

Fortunately, Windows provides two key combinations that will select and deselect the entire contents of a list box, without the need to scroll to the bottom of the list and the risk of missing a file.

To select every item in a list box, you first select one file and then press Ctrl-/ (Control and the forward slash). You can deselect all items, except for the previously selected file, by pressing Ctrl-\ (Control and the back slash).

Saving the Program Manager Configuration

Most people know that one way to save the configuration of Program Manager is to select the Options/Save Settings On Exit menu option. However, this can be time consuming during shutdown of Windows for slow machines or hard drives if all you want to do is save a setting and re-load Windows.

There is a short cut to saving these configurations. To save the configurations without having to actually exit Windows or to save time each time you quit Windows hold down the [SHIFT] key while selecting File/Exit. This will force a save of your configuration (it does not shutdown Windows). There will be some disk activity and eventually your mouse pointer will return to allow you to continue working.

You can now mess up the icons, rearrange groups and not worry that all your changes will be permanent. If you like your changes, save again. This is perfect for PCs that share several family members. My kids were always messing with the icon arrangements (not the way I like them).

Do remember that the "auto save feature" is not set any more if you turn it off and that changes to the arrangement will not be saved unless you do it. This can be frustrating the first couple of times you forget.

This feature can be used with Options/Save Settings On Exit menu option on as well. If you make a bunch of changes and don't want to quit to save them, then save them with the instructions above. Either way the next time you run Windows the settings that you just saved will be used.
