

Q: Dear Expert,

I am having a problem with my computer. I cannot format 3.5" discs anymore. I have tried a number of them, which I've used and reused, and some new ones. They won't reformat. I get a message saying that Windows found a problem in the area of the disk where the system files are being copied.

I'm not aware of any other problems on the computer. Any suggestions?

### Confused

A: Dear Confused.

I've had problems similar to this. Turned out I had a bad floppy drive. Can you still READ disks? Can you WRITE on pre-formatted disks? Don't try to read or write to any disk that has valuable information on it. You might also try running SCANDISK on a blank formatted floppy. This can tell you where it thinks the problems are. If you can read and write and successfully scan the whole floppy, then I'm not sure what the problem might be. Also, chech the BIOS settings. Failing any of these tests may indicate the need for a new drive or realigning the old drive. It's probably cheaper (and easier) to replace the drive than to try and get it re-aligned.

### Expert

Q: Dear Expert,

I can read a disk, and write to the disk. I just can't format it.

Scandisk was done on a disk and my

hard drive - no problems here. I still can not format the disk. I also ran a virus check on the floppies and the hard drives, and found nothing.

I'm using Windows95. I downloaded the service packs from MS and the upgrades for Windows95.

Bios set ok - 3.5" disc for that drive. Nothing wrong seen here.

I guess it isn't important enough for me to replace the disk drive at this time if that is the problem. I just can't format disks.

Still Confused

Q: Dear Expert (2 weeks later)

The problem with the floppy drive not formatting, kind of solved itself. Now it won't access the disk at all. I called Gateway, and they agreed the unit needs replacing, but it is out of warranty. I ordered a new one.

This brings about another problem. I had a combination 3.5 and 5.25 floppy drive system. I don't use the 5.25 anymore, but when I reloaded Windows95 in the past, it asked to see my original 3.1 disk, which is on the 5.25 floppy. It would not reload Windows95 without first seeing the 3.1 disk.

Is there a way to bypass this, or add a

file to the computer that it looks for, without reloading Windows 3.1? Besides, I can't get it there anyway without the 5.25 floppy drive.

Still Confused

A: Dear Still Confused,

You should be able to copy the 5 1/4 to the 3 1/2. Just make sure you get the label of disk correct as well. The label command can be used to change a disk's label.

Another alternative is to name a file (any small file) as WIN.CN\_ .Note the underline as the final character. Put this disk (on a 3 1/2" floppy) in drive A when prompted for floppy disk 1 of Windows 3.x. This tip was presented in a former issue of Windows Magazine. I hope this solves your problem.

### News Flash -Microsoft

REDMOND, Wash.

n direct response to accusations made by the Department of Justice, the Microsoft Corp. announced today that it will be acquiring the federal government of the United States of America for an undisclosed sum.

"It's actually a logical extension of our planned growth", said Microsoft chairman Bill Gates, "It really is going to be a positive arrangement for everyone".

Microsoft representatives held a briefing in the oval office of the White House with U.S. President Bill Clinton, and assured members of the press that changes will be "minimal." The United States will be managed as a wholly owned division of Microsoft. An initial public offering is planned for July of next year, and the federal government is expected to be profitable by "Q4 1999 at latest," according to Microsoft president Steve Ballmer.

In a related announcement, Bill Clinton stated that he had "willingly and enthusiastically" accepted a position as a vice-president with Microsoft, and will continue to manage the United States government, reporting directly to Bill Gates. When asked how it felt to give up the mantle of executive authority to Gates, Clinton smiled and referred to it as "a relief." He went on to say that Gates has a "proven track record", and that U.S. citizens should offer Gates their "full support and confidence." Clinton will reportedly be earning several times the \$200,000 annually he has earned as U.S. president, in his new role at Microsoft.

Gates dismissed a suggestion that the

U.S. Capitol be moved to Redmond as "silly," though did say that he would make executive decisions for the U.S. Government from his existing office at Microsoft headquarters. Gates went on to say that the House and Senate would "of course" be abolished.

"Microsoft isn't a democracy," he observed, "and look how well we're doing."

(An undisclosed source in the Justice Department indicated that Attorney General Janet Reno was in Cupertino, CA discussing "opportunities" with Steven Jobs, CEO of Apple Corporation.)

When asked if the rumored attendant acquisition of Canada was proceeding, Gates said, "We don't deny that discussions are taking place." Microsoft representatives closed the conference by stating that United States citizens will be able to expect lower taxes, increases in government services and discounts on all Microsoft products.

While writing this article a couple of ideas popped into my mind so I fired up Visual FoxPro which is a database program. This is where I have been keeping some of my To Do list items for different software development projects I am currently working on. This To Do list is not very complicated and could be done in a similar fashion in another database, word processor, or spreadsheet. My database table automatically tracks the date I entered in the idea and allows me to sort by priority, date, and project. I absolutely need to keep track of work that needs to be done. I still use a paper based planner to keep track of my nonproject To Do list and appointments, frankly because it is easier and more accessible.

I use Netscape Navigator and Internet Explorer to surf the web almost every day. If you have any stocks or are interested in the performance of a particular stock, check out www. stockmaster.com. I hit this site every day to see how the EDS stock (its on sale if your interested <g>) and Disney stock are doing. This site shows current prices and trend graphs for the last six or twelve months. Excellent

way to stay in the know about your investments.

Other sites I hit almost each day include CNN Interactive at www.cnn. com for up to the minute news, and the Weather Channel at www.weather. com to make sure the weather is not going to conflict with any outdoor plans for the day. Naturally, I hit the Microsoft site at www.microsoft.com quite often to get updates and troubleshoot problems. For fun I check out the local paper sites for the Freep (www.freep.com/comics/index. htm), and the News (www.detnews. com/comics/index.htm) to get a dose of comics. This is a great way to add some humor to the day. By the way, I had my browser open to examine the bookmark so I could include all these URLs in case you were interested in them.

Other tools that I regularly use are Notepad/WordPad and the Windows calculator. I like to use Notepad and WordPad as extended clipboards. The Windows clipboard is used whenever you copy, cut, and paste items within applications. Unfortunately the clipboard only holds one item at a time. I fire up different copies of NotePad for each item I want to keep available. The calculator is just handy and does the job I need it to do. For complicated math I fire up my Microsoft Excel spreadsheet since it has a wealth of financial calculations already built in.

Just another day's work.

National publications have both technical content editors and managing editors that provide plenty of feedback. It is always good to have a second pair of eyes review your work. Don't be afraid, we are all friends here.


